



Finance and Gift Aid

Our 2023 accounts were approved by the trustees on 12rd March and presented to the congregation at the Annual Stated Meeting on 28th April. These showed that our regular offerings fell by 8.5% compared to 2022. This was mainly due to the loss of a number of members. Our income for the year was not enough to cover our expenditure and the accounts show a deficit in the General account of £22,995. We were fortunate to receive



£13,106 by way of a grant from Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme. This was the VAT element of the work carried out on the heating system in the church.

A claim has been made to HMRC for £1,602 on donations of £6,408 under the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme. This scheme allows us to claim up to £2,000 on donations of £30 or less which are given by members who do not have Gift Aid Declarations in place, up to £8,000,

Our gas and electricity contracts have now been transferred to e-on with preferential rates arranged by 121.

I hope everyone enjoys a relaxing break over the summer months whether at home or further afield.
