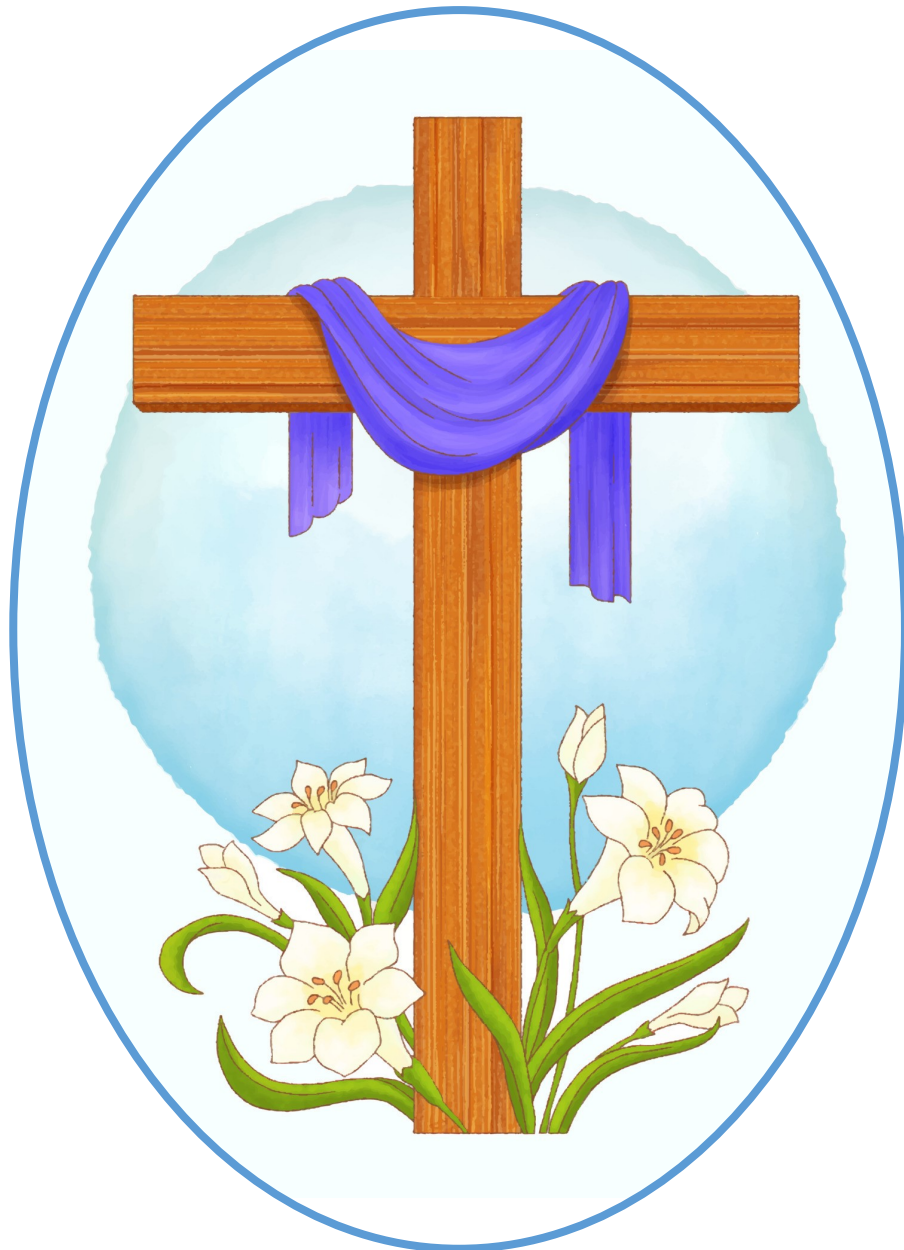

Dear friends,

“We plan, God laughs”

This old Yiddish proverb was quoted by Woody Allen, saying, “If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans.” The perception of reality not living up to our hopes and expectations is timeless as shown in the words of scripture, “Time and chance happen to them all” (Eccl.9:11), and Burns’, “The best laid schemes”. You may recall that I cited that Burns quote in our Tidings article in November 2021, talking about Presbytery Planning while we were still in the throes of on and off lockdown measures. I was also reminded of it in our recent Kirking of the Lanarkshire Association of Burns Clubs.

Yet, we are encouraged to consider the future and determine the cost of our choices. For example, Jesus asked, “For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it?” (Luke 14:28). He applied that to the cost of discipleship, while yet inviting us to take up our cross daily (Luke 9:23).

Our journey following Christ is costly. It involves sacrifices. It involves loving those we likely do not want to love. It involves helping people with whom we might have little in common. It involves following him to places we don’t want to go. It involves a pattern of life that would not be of our choosing were it not because he is the life of that pattern. He is our life. He is “the way, and the truth, and the life” (John 14:6).

That ought to stir us! It ought to stir our deadened emotions. It ought to stir to activity our tired bodies. It ought to stir our distracted minds to think about how we might follow Christ, and not merely as an individual but in company with others. Our Christian faith is rarely exercised alone. God has given us the church to strengthen us and for us to strengthen it, for only as we work together do we rise above our own interests to contribute to something so much bigger than ourselves – the Kingdom of God.



The reality, however, is that we often need a catalyst for change. We need the stimulation of others, of new faces and voices and ideas. We experience this in our day to day lives. We experience this in our Sunday patterns of church life. We have another opportunity to experience it in Presbytery Planning that, despite a winding trail, finally looks set to let the congregations of Hamilton West and Hamilton Old consider going into Union together. But, we most especially find it in the way God regularly surprises us in the face of our Jesus.

God laughs. But God also plans. “For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.” (Jer.29:11). I would rather think that God laughs with us than at us. Consequently, I only hope and pray that the plans we might make, individually, together, and in every aspect of our lives, are plans aligned with His.

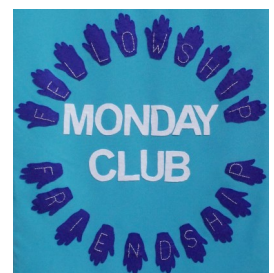
Looking forward to February:

As well as the events outlined above, the normal work of the Company carries on a pace with badgework, games and fun Galore.

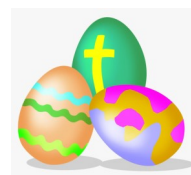

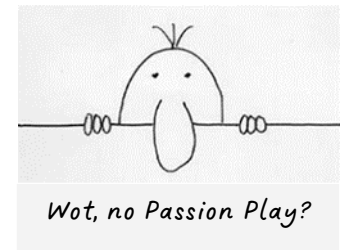

## Finance

At the time of writing, the 2022 accounts are being finalised and will be presented to the Trustees on 14th March for approval. The date of the Annual Stated Meeting is 2nd April 2023.

The Gift Aid claim for 2022 has been submitted and paid by HMRC. The total gift aided income was **£84,199** (£84,671 for 2021) which gave us a refund of tax amounting to **£21,049** (£21,168 for 2021). This is a slight drop from last year which was higher due to a number of members 'catching up' from when the church was closed.

The table below shows a breakdown of the different elements included in the return along with the previous years' figures for comparison. If you have any questions or would like any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me.

At present we have 160 declarations in place representing 222 members. If you pay tax and would like to contribute extra to the church at no cost to yourself, please speak to me. For every £1.00 you contribute HMRC will refund us 25p of the tax you have already paid. Also, if you stop paying tax or change your address it is important that you let me know.

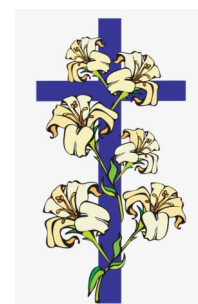

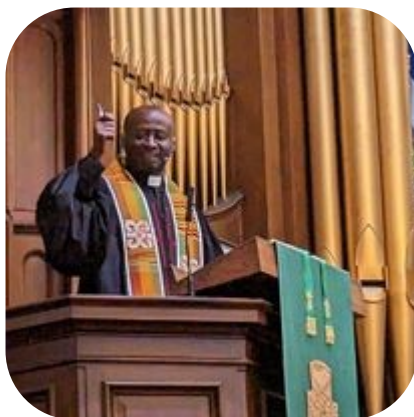
## Old Kirk Reflections
