Along the journey of life there are those I've grown closer to, those who have drifted, and those who have passed away. It reminds me of an old Christian friend of mine, now departed to glory, who once commented that more of his friends were in heaven than were left on earth. It can sometimes feel like that, though that's not a thought that ought to leave us despondent. We anticipate a great reception when our turn finally comes.

My mind then turned to so many different songs about friendship. The song, "You're my Best Friend" echoed in my ears. It was written by Bass guitarist John Deacon as he learned to play the piano, and recorded by Freddie Mercury and Queen in 1975, hot on the heels of their huge hit "Bohemian Rhapsody". But my ear wasn't long in turning to the refrains of "What a Friend we have in Jesus", written in 1855 after a series of tragedies experienced by the Irish immigrant to Canada, Joseph Scriven.

Last but not least, we look forward to sharing Communion as friends in Hamilton West Church in March, as we work towards a church Union. It will be lovely to worship in that Church, just as we have all come together in warm fellowship in the Old Parish Church. It's reminiscent of the lead up to the Union with the North Parish, and very welcome.

Our friendships endure, our love endures – of friends, family, God, and His church. Yet, we do well to take none of them for granted. Every single one is precious. I would like to encourage us all to nurture them rather than neglect them. Even lifting a phone can make someone's day. Meeting face to face... can be a tonic for the soul.

Finance and Gift Aid

At the time of writing, the 2023 accounts are being finalised and will be presented to the Trustees on 12 March for approval. The date of the Annual Stated Meeting is 28 April 2024.

The Gift Aid claim for 2023 has been submitted and paid by HMRC. The total gift aided income was £93,474 (£84,199 for 2022) which gave us a refund of tax amounting to £23,368 (£21,049 for 2022). This included a number of donations to the heating project. The claim would have been just under £5,000 less than 2022 if these donations had not been received. This is due mainly to loss of a number of members during the year.

The table below shows a breakdown of the different elements included in the return along with the previous years' figures for comparison. If you have any questions or would like any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me.

At present we have 148 declarations in place representing 192 members. If you pay tax and would like to contribute extra to the church at no cost to yourself, please speak to me. For every £1.00 you contribute HMRC will refund us 25p of the tax you have already paid. Also, if you stop paying tax or change your address it is important that you let me know.

Once again, many thanks to everyone for your commitment in supporting God's work in the church locally and nationally especially during this continuing difficult time.


